




**DELAY IN INSTALLATION OF MONUMENTS

Each time we have had the cement truck on the calendar to deliver cement, it has either rained a day or so before or on the scheduled day of delivery. Unfortunately, the pouring has not been able to be done. We understand that Cedar Hill Cemetery as well as other area cemeteries have had the same problem with grounds that are too wet.

TWENTY-EIGHTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME**

First Reading: Wisdom 7:7-11

This poem discusses how the spirit of wisdom is far more beautiful than any riches could be. All gold is no more than sand when compared to the importance of wisdom, which often leads people to the other good things in life.

Second Reading: Hebrews 4:12-13

God's perception of people is called "sharper than any two-edged sword." God is able to know the thoughts and feelings of all his people. We can hide nothing from him, and will need to account for all he has seen in us.

Gospel: Mark 10:17-30
